In addition, I, the undersigned, have read and understand the following. I have reviewed the health/veterinary record kept by WMER&R about this horse/mule/donkey. I understand I may have a veterinarian of my choice examine this horse/mule/donkey at my expense and I understand any health issues my veterinarian has diagnosed.
